DISCUSSION: Attorney Warshaw stated that the Pennsylvania Food Merchants Association, on behalf of its members, petitions the Board to hold a hearing, at the Board's convenience, regarding the minimum retail prices on retail products regulated by the Board. It is his hope that the necessary data will be ready for a hearing in January. They will be meeting with Attorney Saylor following today's meeting.

DISCUSSION: Attorney Eberly stated that the Board will meet following the Sunshine meeting to discuss today's hearing. No deliberations nor official actions will be taken.

7. LEGAL CASE DISPOSITIONS

1. Wayne Harman Trucking late hauler monthly reports, late payment of hauler fees, late renewal of hauler license, operating without a license

PRESENTED by: Attorney Saylor

DISCUSSION: Attorney Saylor presented **1. Legal Docket CA-18-007 for Wayne Harman Trucking** for the late monthly hauler reports, late payment of hauler fees, late renewal of hauler license, and operating without a license. A consent order was signed and a penalty of one thousand eight hundred dollars (\$1,800.00) was paid.

DISCUSSION: Attorney Saylor explained the reason for the significant penalty amount is due to a long record of violations. His previous violations include a \$50.00, \$150.00, \$500.00, \$900.00 and today's \$1,800.00 consent order. It has been an ongoing issue, and we were prepared for a hearing this time, but it appears there is now a long-term resolution in place.

Member Van Blarcom inquired if the resolution was that the company he deals with is handling it. Attorney Saylor stated that the company for which he delivers the milk has offered to file and pay the monthly reports on his behalf. This is now set in place.

Consumer Member Hardbarger inquired if this was something dealt with personally or was it handled electronically? Attorney Saylor stated that he has dealt with him personally several times. He is a small business but has been in business a long time, and the company he works with appreciates their hauling for them. Staff has gone the extra mile to work with him for the follow through of the reports and fees. Compliance is our goal always.

With Board approval of this application, a subdealer license will be issued.
